The word Tetelestai is a Greek word meaning "It is finished" and is the title of the musical production of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus that has been carried out for the last 41 years. The Cleveland Performing Arts Ministries will be holding auditions for this year's program on December 1 and 2, and December 8 and 9, Saturday from 8-4pm, and Sunday from 10-4 pm. Rehearsals are at Gilmore Academy in Gates Mills. The commitment requires rehearsals on Saturdays beginning January 5 through February 23 from 8:30am to 5pm. Performances begin March 1 and run through April 19 on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. **Tetelestai will be performed at our church the weekend of April 5-7, 2019.** If you wish to audition and can commit to the rehearsals and performance times, efforts will be made to provide transportation.
