AUDITIONS FOR TETELESTAI

The word Tetelestai is a Greek word meaning "It is finished" and is the title of the musical production of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus that has been carried out for the last 41 years. The Cleveland Performing Arts Ministries will be holding auditions for this year's program on December 1 and 2, and December 8 and 9, Saturday from 8-4pm, and Sunday from 10-4 pm. Rehearsals are at Gilmore Academy in Gates Mills. The commitment requires rehearsals on Saturdays beginning January 5 through February 23 from 8:30am to 5pm. Performances begin March 1 and run through April 19 on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. **Tetelestai will be performed at our church the weekend of April 5-7, 2019.** If you wish to audition and can commit to the rehearsals and performance times, efforts will be made to provide transportation. SECOND COLLECTION CHANGES

It has been a long practice at SAOLF to have a second collection each Sunday at Mass. These collections are for specific purposes, and some are designated to be sent to the Diocese for distribution to the proper cause. The diocesan designated collections have envelopes provided in the envelope box each year, as well as our own Charity Fund and Building Maintenance Fund. Using these envelopes provides accountability for both you and the parish that your gift is properly credited. All of these envelopes may be placed in the main collection basket and will be sorted to the proper charity, organization, or regular tithe as marked. With the approval of the Finance Council, beginning in January there will be no second basket passed through the church for a second offering. Please use the **printed and designated special collection envelopes in your boxes or take one from the table in the Narthex or Gallery.** This will streamline the offering process and simplify the closing rites of Mass on Sunday. More information will be provided over the next several weeks before

implementation. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance.
