WOMEN IN HISTORY...

The two highest IQ's ever recorded through standardized testing both belong to women.

Marie Curie is the only woman to ever win two Nobel Prizes in both Physics and in Chemistry for her work on the study of radiation.

Jane Addams was the first woman to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize as a philosopher, writer, leader, and supporter of womens' right to vote.

Nellie Taylor Ross was the first woman elected governor in Wyoming. It was also the first state to grant women the right to vote.
