SCHUBERT HALL UPDATE

Some have asked where we are in the project to replace Schubert Hall. At this time, we have been able to complete most of the engineering work on the site to submit a plan for storm water flow and retention in the parking lot areas (Remember, our current lot by the hall has no drains and flows onto the street. That is no longer allowed by law, and has to be corrected in any work we do). We must next do soil borings to determine composition and to see if there is any buried "treasure" that needs to be removed (old building debris, etc.). We are preparing a RFP (request for proposal) to be sent out to

architects to consider the project. If you know certified architectural firms that you think should be considered, please let Br Bob know ASAP. Further updates will be made as information becomes available.
