SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

Jesus heals ten lepers in today's Gospel, but only one returns to give thanks to God. This one grateful person was the least likely to do anything good in the eyes of those listening to Jesus, as this one was a Samaritan. The Pharisees and most of Jerusalem with them wrote off the Samaritans over differences in religious observance; yet it was this outcast who revealed that he alone had the proper disposition of gratitude. We are all challenged this weekend to be grateful for what we have received, but to also be careful in writing off others who are different than ourselves. We don't know the inspirations of their hearts nor do we know the work of Grace in their lives. May we always remember to give thanks for what God has done for us, and remember that God does great things in those whom we might least expect. This week, live the attitude of gratitude!
