THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

Lent is a season of enlightenment. This season is when Jesus Christ enlightens our minds and our hearts to reveal to us his true identity and mission. The identity of Jesus is Messiah and the mission of Jesus is to save us from our sins and to reconcile us to the Father. Today in the Gospel of John we hear the story of the Samaritan Woman. Jesus encounters a Samaritan woman at the well and strikes up a conversation with her. This conversation is no ordinary conversation because it will eventually lead to the conversion of the Samaritan woman who accepts Jesus as the Messiah. How many conversations do we have with people daily, do we use our conversations with people as opportunities of evangelization or are our conversations about everything except about the Lord? Jesus uses his conversation with the Samaritan woman to enlighten her about his identity. The woman first identifies Jesus as a prophet then finally as the Messiah. This enlightenment spurs her on to go tell others about her encounter with Jesus. Some of us have images of God that are skewed by our experiences. By having a honest conversation with Jesus in prayer and reading of Scriptures, Jesus will hopefully enlighten and reveal to us his true identity. Jesus will heal our skewed images about God and reveal to us that he is the Messiah who comes to save us from our sins and reconcile us with the Father. May we in turn go tell others about Jesus like the Samaritan woman.
