FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

The Gospel reading for this Sunday is the famous story of the raising of Lazarus by Jesus. I suppose our lives these days are colored by the Covid-19 virus (Coronavirus) pandemic, and constantly listening to cable news could lead us to despair and hopelessness. As Christians, in the midst of pain and crisis we can't afford to despair and lose hope. We need to turn to Jesus who promises his love for us and promises that he will never abandon those who believe.

In the Gospel of John we read today, Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days. The Gospel writer wanted to stress the fact that Lazarus was definitely dead and there was no ambiguity about his fate. In other words, the situation of Lazarus was lifeless and hopeless. Lazarus could not come back from the dead. Martha his sister, believed that his brother was gone forever and that he would be raised only at the resurrection of the dead. Jesus however, had the power of life over death; Jesus could bring Lazarus back to life and he asked Martha to trust in him. As Jesus brought Lazarus back to life from dead, Martha had to move from the physical limitations that her brother's death imposed on her; or, or she could trust in Jesus' words that he had the power of life over death.

During this season of uncertainty, we might be incapacitated by fear and the physical limitations that this virus imposes on us. Jesus calls us to believe and trust in him. Jesus tells you and me today that if we believe and trust in him, he will set us free from the power of sin, illness, and death. Like Martha, let us make an act of faith. Let us proclaim and believe that Jesus loves us and that Jesus will heal us and bring us out of these desperate times.
