SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

It has been almost two months that our lives as we knew it changed because of the Coronavirus Pandemic. During these past weeks, we have seen many fall sick and die, the economy tanking, and many losing their jobs. This crisis has pushed our health care system and economy to the limit. In other words, the things in this world that we trusted in and hoped in like the economy and our health system are not as reliable as we might have thought. Considering that the goods of this world are not as reliable as we thought, what or who should we rely on or hope in? We do well to turn to the second reading of today's liturgy taken from 1 Peter to guide us in these tumultuous times. Peter tells his listeners that they need to be ready to give a reason for their hope. Hope is a virtue or attitude we have in the face of difficulties that things will get better. Obviously, the reason for his listeners' hope is the risen Jesus who overcame all that impinges on human life, especially death. As you face difficulties, do you trust in human strength or do you rely on Jesus? Jesus will strengthen you to deal with the challenges you encounter if you rely and trust in him and not in yourself. If we trust in the Lord Jesus, our suffering will not magically disappear but God will give us the strength to persevere and overcome. And as we overcome our sufferings, we help others overcome their sufferings by telling them who we hoped in and relied in times of our own difficulties.

6. First Holy Communion and Confirmation will be rescheduled according to when we are permitted again to gather for mass.

CHURCH REOPENING MAY 30/31

We are preparing to reopen our church for Sunday Masses on Saturday and Sunday May 30/31. ***We are permitted no more than 50% capacity at any one mass, meaning a maximum of 160 persons at each mass. Given requirements for social distancing, the actual number permitted will be less.*** As we prepare to join together, all are asked to observe the following:

1. All are asked to enter the church through the front wooden doors. The office entrance to the church will be closed and unavailable for entry.
2. Sanitizer will be provided at the entrance of the church. **It is recommended that you bring your own personal sanitizer as well.**
3. **All will be asked to wear masks or face coverings of some kind. If you enter without a mask, you will kindly be asked to return when you have one.** This is so that if you have the virus unknowingly, you are less likely to spread it to others.
4. If you are not feeling well, have a temperature, or have been exposed to the Covid19 virus; if you are a vulnerable person due to health issues or age, please do NOT come to Sunday mass. There is still no obligation to attend at this time.
5. Please consider attending the 5pm Saturday and 830 am Sunday Masses that are less filled. Again, once capacity is reached, admission into the church cannot be granted.

PARISH TRANSITIONS

After 20 years of faithful and generous service to our parish. Toni Smith will be moving on from her current role as Youth Minister at St. Agnes Our Lady of Fatima. In that same vein, Melissa McCall will also come to the end of her current service in assistance to Ms. Mack in religious education and sacramental preparation as part of this restructuring.

These changes will occur as of June 30 when the restructuring comes into effect. Mrs. Mack has already made known her intention to retire in June. There will be an opportunity to formally thank Ms. Smith, Ms. Mack, Ms. McCall at a time yet to be determined.

New Job descriptions and qualifications for a reconfigured pastoral staff are posted on the parish website. Any who meet those qualifications who are members of the parish or beyond may apply. Please continue to pray for our parish as we move forward in faith and trust in God.

BUILDING UPDATE

All contracts are finalized and we are awaiting a response from the City of Cleveland regarding property setbacks and a meeting with the design review committee. These meetings are delayed under the current pandemic situation so we need be patient and prayerful. There is also a possible property available that borders the church yard that will help with parking and traffic flow. As soon as the demolition permit is received, work will begin to dismantle Schubert Hall. Work has also begun to rebuild the porches on the front of the parish house that have begun to sag and pull away from the building. Next, bids will be secured to waterproof the foundation and replace the siding on the house. More updates will follow as work progresses. Thank you!
