SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples of Jesus as tongues of fire. The reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us that when the tongues of fire rested on the disciples, they spoke in different and varied tongues. The disciples spoke in different languages as the Spirit allowed them to speak. Some Christians think speaking in tongues means speaking a foreign obscure language that is not understandable, however, nothing could be further from the truth. The different tongues that the disciples spoke were understood by devout Jews who came from different parts of the world. It must be highlighted here that the Holy Spirit inspired the disciples to preach the mighty deeds of God to people of other nations. I think we could infer from this that we are called to preach the gospel to people of different nations and backgrounds. We do so by speaking other people's language both literally and figuratively. Think about the many different people who come to our church, each person has a unique story, identity and culture. What if we could preach the gospel to them by being sensitive to their uniqueness, I think this will go a long way to allow individuals to encounter Jesus in a personal and real way. Today, we are called to be evangelizers and missionaries, may the Holy Spirit help us to do just that.

AS WE RETURN...

Please note the following as we transition back into regular church activities within the limits placed on us by the state and the diocese.

1. We are streaming Sunday Mass at 10:30 each Sunday on Facebook and uploading it to our website.

2. There is daily mass on EWTN and Fox 8 will air the TV Mass on Sunday mornings at 6. There is also daily mass available at dioceseofcleveland.org.
3. Regular group meetings are still suspended as are any social gatherings at the church. We are looking into ZOOM meetings for various groups who may want to consider that, as our staff has had its first one last week.
4. Due to Covid19 and lack of activities at church, several positions have been eliminated, including evening receptionist, hall manager and maintenance, as well as custodian.
5. The immediacy to hire staff at this time is not urgent until it can be determined when we can gather for large group activities and formation. Again, creative ways will need to be explored moving forward.

CHURCH REOPENING MAY 30/31

As we open today, we do so under a few constraints and restrictions. **We are permitted no more than 50% capacity at any one mass, meaning a maximum**

of 160 persons at each mass. Given requirements for social distancing, the actual number permitted will be at 75. As we prepare to join together, all are asked to observe the following:

1. All are asked to enter the church through the front wooden doors. The office entrance to the church will be closed and unavailable for entry.
2. Sanitizer will be provided at the entrance of the church. **It is recommended that you bring your own personal sanitizer as well.**
3. **All will be asked to wear masks or face coverings of some kind. If you enter without a mask, you will kindly be asked to return when you have one.** This is so that if you have the virus unknowingly, you are less likely to spread it to others.
4. **Please observe distancing and the markings on the floor at six feet intervals.** The Father Judge Chapel will remain closed for the time being.
5. If you are not feeling well, have a temperature, or have been exposed to the Covid19 virus; if you are a vulnerable person due to health issues or age, please do NOT come to Sunday mass. There is still no obligation to attend at this time.
6. Please consider attending the 5pm Saturday and 830 am Sunday Masses that are less filled. Again, once capacity is reached, admission into the church cannot be granted.

PARISH TRANSITIONS

After 20 years of faithful and generous service to our parish. Toni Smith will be moving on from her current role as Youth Minister at St. Agnes Our Lady of Fatima. In that same vein, Melissa McCall will also come to the end of her current service in assistance to Ms. Mack in religious education and sacramental preparation as part of this restructuring. These changes will occur as of June 30 when the restructuring comes into effect. Mrs. Mack has already made known her intention to retire in June. There will be an opportunity to formally thank Ms. Smith, Ms. Mack, Ms. McCall at a time yet to be determined.

New Job descriptions and qualifications for a reconfigured pastoral staff are posted on the parish website. Any who meet those qualifications who are members of the parish or beyond may apply. Please

continue to pray for our parish as we move forward in faith and trust in God.

BUILDING UPDATE

All contracts are finalized and we are awaiting a response from the City of Cleveland regarding property setbacks and a meeting with the design review committee. These meetings are delayed under the current pandemic situation so we need be patient and prayerful. There is also a possible property available that borders the church yard that will help with parking and traffic flow. As soon as the demolition permit is received, work will begin to dismantle Schubert Hall. Work has also begun to rebuild the porches on the front of the parish house that have begun to sag and pull away from the building. Next, bids will be secured to waterproof the foundation and replace the siding on the house. More updates will follow as work progresses. Thank you!
