PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Pastoral Council met in extraordinary session to consider the first letter sent by Bishop Malesic to the faithful of the Diocese in regard to the upcoming election this week. While the letter addressed concerns regarding voting with and informed conscience and the importance of supporting an agenda consistent with our Faith, it fell short of addressing the violence and division facing our country, the systemic racism that has been exposed, and the concerns of our community as related to COVID19 and the Black Lives Matter Movement. Our parish council has prepared a response in collaboration with the other parishes in our community to raise these concerns with Bishop Malesic at the beginning of his time of service. A copy of the letter from Bishop Malesic is available on the diocesan website and through the Office of Ministry to African American Catholics. Once the Council response is prepared, it will be posted to our website and available in hard copy with the bulletin in church. Please remain prayerful and vigilant in making our voice heard in our nation and in our Church!

BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

Black Catholic History has been made with the appointment of Archbishop Wilton Gregory of Washington D.C. to the College of Cardinals. Cardinal Gregory is the first African American Cardinal named and will receive his title and office from Pope Francis at ceremonies in Rome. Cardinal Gregory visited Fatima in the early '90's and was part of the Imani Faith Education Series that was pioneered by our parish at that time. It is Cardinal Gregory who publicly spoke out against the Knights of Columbus in welcoming President Trump to the John Paul II museum in Washington after the president forcibly removed protesters from the streets outside the White House. Let us pray for the Cardinal Archbishop in his role and his ministry to the Church in the United States and the world.

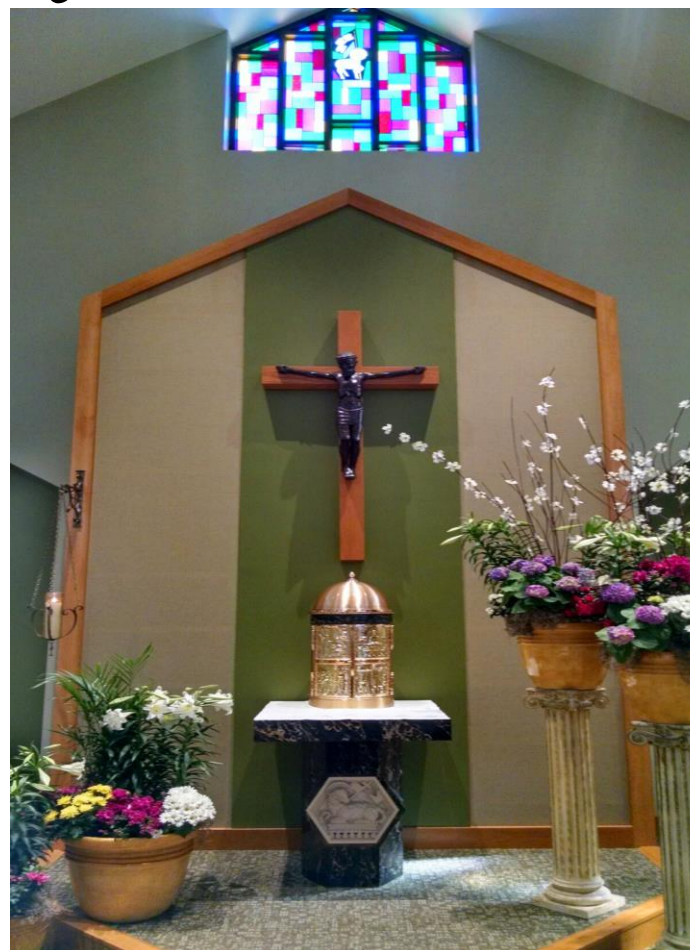
CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE
