

NOVEMBER 6, 2022 THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

In Eucharistic Prayer III prayed by the priest during the Mass, there is a part used during a funeral mass in which the priest prays, "Remember your servant (*Name of the Deceased*) whom you have called from this world to yourself. Grant that he (she) who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection, when from the earth he will raise up in the flesh those who have died, and transform our lowly body after the pattern of his own glorious body. This prayer is a reminder for us Christians that "faith in the resurrection of our bodies is inseparable from our faith in the Resurrection of Christ's body from the dead." (Adult Catechism, p155) Throughout Scripture, the God the Father reveals his plan to transform our mortal bodies into the likeness of his Son's Glorified Body. These same bodies will be reunited to our souls in the Second Coming of Christ, yet they will be made perfect in Him who loves the human being body and soul. Those who love Him by keeping His commandments, most notably, the Great Commandment of Love, will not fear the Last Judgment as it is proclaimed in the Gospel of Matthew 25:31-32. They will be called children of God free from all corruption will rejoice before the God of the living for all eternity. May this be our hope as we remember that everything that Jesus did and does for humans is to give humans life body and soul. Therefore, as Christians let us promote life from conception until natural death like Jesus, for our God is a God of the living and not of the dead. In doing this, the power of the resurrection will be at work our lives, the Church and the world.

BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated **November as Black Catholic History Month** to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. Two commemorative dates fall within this month: St. Augustine's birthday, Nov. 13, and St. Martin de Porres' feast day, Nov. 3. November is also when Catholics celebrate the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, an occasion to recall in a special way the saints and souls of Africa and the African Diaspora.*
