SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK THE OBEDIENCE OF FAITH!

To obey (from the Latin ob-audire, to "hear or listen to") in faith is to submit freely to the word that has been heard, because its truth is guaranteed by God, who is Truth itself. Abraham is the model of such obedience offered us by Sacred Scripture. The Virgin Mary is its most perfect embodiment. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #144)

When we think of being obedient to someone our immediate response can be "what?, I have to give up my own freedom to choose and conform my life to someone else's power!" This understanding of obedience can leave a sour taste in our mouth and make us want to run away from what will seem to restrict us. When it comes to our faith, we need to move towards a deeper understanding of obedience. In the second reading for this final Sunday of Advent, St Paul opens his letter to the Romans telling us that, through Christ, we have received the grace of apostleship, to bring about the obedience of faith (Romans1:5). God became a human being to make it possible for all human beings to have eternal life and perfect happiness in Him! A life that is being formed in all of us at this very moment and that will come to fulfillment in a new eternal reality when Christ comes again at the end of time. This is the faith we are called to be obedient to. A faith freely given to us by God Himself, in His Son Jesus, and through the working of the Holy Spirit in our families, our community, and our Church. We simply need to listen and submit ourselves to the word that has been heard (CCC, 144), following in the footsteps of Abraham, Isaiah, the Virgin Mary, blessed St Joseph, and all those who have walked in faith before us. Our revivalist, Fr. Roy Lee, reminded us this past week to order our steps to the coming of the Lord this Christmas and every day of our lives. In this last week of preparation for the coming of our Lord, we can make a simple act of faithful obedience today by saving "YES. Lord. order my steps. to walk in the way of holiness you have made for me!" -Fr. David Domanski, OFM Cap.


HAM JAM Give Away
