February 5, 2023 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

In Last week's Gospel, Jesus begins His Sermon on the Mount teaching his listeners how to become Blessed. It is by living the Beatitudes. The Catholic Catechism defines tells us that "The Beatitudes depict the countenance of Jesus Christ and portray his charity. They express the vocation of the faithful associated with the glory of his Passion and Resurrection; they shed light on the actions and attitudes characteristic of the Christian life; they proclaim the blessings and rewards already secured, however dimly, for Christ's disciples" (CCC 1717). In this week's Gospel, Jesus builds on this teaching pointing out that living the beatitudes transforms the disciple into "salt" of the Earth and "light" of the world. Let's focus on the salt in this reflection. We know that salt (not too much) is often used to flavor food. We also know that it serves as a preservative, and it is also known for its antibacterial properties particularly when used for oral infections and other injuries. In other words, salt is good and useful. It brings flavor to tasteless food; it helps preserve some foods delaying them from going bad too quickly, and it also helps in the healing process during sickness. The disciple is called to be like salt in the lives of those who have experienced a "bad taste" in life due to their sufferings. The poor, oppressed, imprisoned, sick, orphaned, refugeed and many others might say they've had enough of the world like a bad meal. Encountering a disciple of Jesus should be like tasting and seeing the goodness of the Lord(Psalm 34:9). And for those suffering from the virus of sin, the disciple brings the healing power of Christ's mercy and forgiveness into that woundedness through acts of mercy.
