SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

The Gospel we hear on Palm Sunday every year covers the events of Jesus' life that are core to our faith. The verses from Matthew's Gospel are often broken up into the form of a narrative reenactment with different parts spoken by the presiding priest, deacon, lector, and the faithful in attendance in the pews. This adds theater to the most dramatic moment of Jesus' life on earth as He is betrayed and denied by his own brother disciples, put on trial for crimes He did not commit, and then sentenced to the death penalty in the most terrifying way known at the time, crucifixion. The rejection, passion, and death which Jesus willingly entered into and then overcame with His resurrection are what His mission was all about. As much as He trembled in the Garden of Gethsemane, knowing the pain and suffering He would face the next day, He chose to do the will of His Father in Heaven. Jesus and the Father are united in their will to bring us into union with themselves all the way to the Cross! This is the eternal reality that our faith and hope are centered on and originate from! Let's take this to heart as we enter into this Holy Week and meditate on the passion and death Jesus endured out of His tremendous mercy and love for each and every one of us! – Fr. Dave Domanski
