SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

In today's Gospel, our Lord Jesus gives us a peek into his Sacred Heart. The Gospel tells us that His heart was moved with pity for His sheep who suffered from a lack of spiritual guidance. This glance into the heart of Jesus, also reveals the heart of the Father who in the first reading reminds Israel of His love for them. "You have seen for vourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself." (Exodus 19:4). Jesus' words lead us to recall the message from the prophet Ezekiel in chapter 34 who proclaimed to the corrupt leaders of Israel that they have failed to shepherd the Lord's people as they had been commissioned to do. In that same chapter, God proclaimed that he would rescue his people from those corrupt leaders who either abandoned or abused the people leaving them vulnerable to slavery to sin. God proclaimed, "I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest..." (Ezekiel 34:15). Jesus is the fulfilment of that promise. He continues to compassionately rescue and shepherd His sheep through the faithful leaders of His Church who have received authority from Him to proclaim, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand." We pray that the Lord will send more faithful shepherds who have the heart of Jesus for the sheep.
