August 27, 2023 **Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time**

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

In the Gospel, Jesus encounters a Gentile, non-Jewish woman who apparently knew of Jesus and had come to faith in Him as Lord. This encounter teaches us about the disposition we should have in our relationship with God and how we should pray, particularly in this case, prayers of supplication. The woman first acknowledges Jesus as Lord. In this she clearly respects His authority knowing that Jesus is not obligated to answer her prayer as she cries out, "Have pity on me...". Her strong *faith* that He could heal her daughter is evident in her coming to Him and paying Him homage. A strong love for her daughter drives her *persistence* in pursuing Jesus despite the disciples rejection of her, most likely, because she was a Gentile. Then she reveals a *humble* spirit in response to Jesus' statement, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." She is not put off by Jesus' statement and she recognizes that she is not an ethnic Jew and has no claim on God; however, she desires to be considered a member of the family of God even if it is in a lower position. Approaching our Lord with faith, perseverance rooted in love and humility like this woman moves the heart of the Lord who will respond with generous mercy.


