### October 29, 2023 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

Jesus' reminds us in today's Gospel to put God first. In His response to the Scribe, Jesus refers to Deuteronomy 6:15: "You shall love the Lord your God ..." The Jewish people have always even to this day prayed this prayer called the "Shema" several times a day, and it can be found written on all of their doorposts. We are reminded to make the relationship with the One who loved us first as the primary focus in our lives. Why? Because in that relationship of love, we receive the divine love we need to love our neighbor. This is why Jesus refers also to Leviticus 19:18: "You shall love your neighbor ..." Jesus unites the two commandments making it clear that we cannot claim to love of God without loving others even our enemies. At the same time, love of neighbor cannot exist without a holy love for God. That is why St. John tells us in his letter, "If anyone says, 'I love God,' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen."(1 John 4:20). May we continue to put God first in our lives receiving His love so that we can mature in self-sacrificial love.




