SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

Mark begins his Gospel with the words, "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." These words signify much more than just a disclosure of information about to be revealed. With the words, "The beginning," the reader recalls the opening words of Genesis, "In the Beginning..." and is compelled to see the coming of Christ as a new beginning in history. That God's promise of a savior is at hand and that all creation has been renewed. This is a time of rejoicing as the word "gospel" signifies. The word Gospel is rightly translated as "good news", however, it can also be translated as "joyful tiding." Therefore, this is a time of rejoicing is the message the evangelist is trying to convey to his audience. He is also echoing what we here in the first reading as the Israelites are exhorted by the prophet to rejoice as their time of exile has come to an end. Their "guilt is expiated" and they have been set free to return home. Jesus has come to set us free from our sins and has made a clear path for us to journey to our eternal home. All we have to do is follow Him. May this Advent season be a time for us to live joyfully as a people set free, journeying to our eternal home and continuing to do Jesus' work of making clear the path for others to encounter Jesus by being heralds of the Gospel.

NOTICE TO ALL PARISHIONERS
Please remember that the Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America state that no communicant who is not a priest may perform INTINCTION.
INTINCTION is the Eucharistic practice of partly dipping the

consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine before consumption by the communicant.

The communicant, including the extraordinary minister, is never allowed to self-communicate, even by means of intinction. Communion under either form, bread or wine, must always be given by an ordinary or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion.(NDRHC# 50)
