SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

This Sunday we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word which means "rejoice". To signify this is a time of rejoicing, the priest, concelebrants and deacon have the option of wearing rose colored vestments. We also light the rose candle on the Advent Wreath. Saint Paul in the reading to the Thessalonians today invites us to "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing." For some of us, this can be very difficult especially during this time of year if we are grieving the loss of someone we loved, experiencing the loss of work, illness or other painful difficulties. It can be difficult to rejoice when facing imprisonment of sin, bad habits and personal struggles. However, when we recognize the call to pray always, we come to realize the call is actually a reminder to stay in relationship with Jesus, the One who sets us free. The Prophet Isaiah helps us with the prophetic words announcing that the Lord has come and is with us. We can rejoice that the Promised Savior has come and is Emmanuel, "God is with us." He is not distant. He has come to do what? "... to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners..." May this prophetic message, the examples of our ancestors and all the prophets and the words of St. Paul remind us and strengthen our faith that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Living Word, has come, is with us and will come again to welcome us into eternal holiness. REJOICE ALWAYS!
