March 31, 2024 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

Just a few days ago on Good Friday, all that Jesus did and said seemed to have ended in failure. Jesus was dead and buried, and His friends were hiding in fear and doubt. But today, we rejoice because what seemed like a complete failure was actually a victory. Our Lord has conquered sin and death through His obedience, even to death. (Philippians 2:8). The greatest miracle of all has been performed, the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior. Jesus' Resurrection proved that He was not just another healer, preacher, miracle worker, prophet. He was truly the Son of God who has fulfilled the promise of a Messiah proclaimed by all the prophets as we heard in the Acts of the Apostles today: "To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." (Acts 10:43) These words also reveal that Jesus Christ desires to fulfill his promise for us who believe in Him. What was that promise? That we will share in His victory over sin and death by rising with Him also, as He told his disciples in John 12: 26, "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me." (John 12: 26). Therefore, we should have no fear to follow Him by serving Him, embracing our crosses and dying with Him. If we do so, our faith assures us that we will rise with Him. May this Easter Season dispel all our fears and anxieties, knowing that we have a Savior who is true to His word, and will give us a share in His Risen Life if we but trust and believe. With Easter joy, let us thank God for letting us share in this glorious victory.

Next Sunday Afternoon, there will be a Eucharistic Holy Hour for Divine Mercy Sunday. Which will include prayer the DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would



henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image.

Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (*Diary*, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (*Diary*, no. 687).


